Ponderings

The celebration of Epiphany calls us to reflect on “gifts.” We read the scripture passage about the three kings who come to pay homage to the ‘newborn King’ with their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

It’s a good thing that they brought the gifts with them-----if they tried to bring those same gifts today there might be a ‘supply chain’ problem!! I am not sure if you have experienced the supply chain problem. We read about certain foods that are difficult to get or are much more expensive including: cream cheese, carbonated drinks, chicken, coffee, diapers, fish sticks, frozen meals, ketchup packets, rice krispie treats, sour patch kids and once again, toilet paper. The ‘goods’ in short supply, at least according to one article I read includes: electronics, video games, toys, cars and appliances.

Too bad for me that I was going to plan a menu that included all of the above ingredients: chicken with cream cheese and tomato ketchup and then for dessert rice krispie treats and coffee (no, not really!)

We like to receive gifts! Some of those gifts are wrapped and some of them are the ones that cannot wrap. What are those gifts in the second category----those cannot be wrapped?

From the prophet Isaiah we read, “For a child is born to us, a son is given to us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace.” Think of the Handel’s Messiah----where we hear this passage set to music----an inspirational piece of music. What if the gifts we were searching for came from those ‘titles’ for the Messiah?

What might a ‘Wonder-Counselor’ do for me? How is my sense of ‘wonder’? Young children have a sense of ‘wonder’----don’t we take delight when they discover something new----even watching them play with a new toy can bring a smile to our face! Do we still ‘wonder’ as we age? Do we look out at the winter sky at night, stare at the moon and stars and ‘wonder’ about how magnificent a Creator we have? Let the Christ child renew in you a sense of Wonder during this Christmas season.

What might a God-Hero do for me? We sometimes throw around the word ‘hero’ too much and too lightly. A hero is someone who is truly selfless-----always ready to reach out to help another. Sometimes we think of ‘super-heroes’-----in movies! Sometimes we think about professional athletes or music/performance artists as heroes. Rightly, during the pandemic we have recognized a whole different category of heroes-----first responders. The work of ‘first responders’ is to help others----to unselfishly provide for the needs of another. Is it possible to talk about Jesus as “First” among “First-Responders”?!

What might a Father-Forever do for me? A Father cares for his children. A Father provides for his children. A Father loves his children. A Father passes on wisdom to his children. A Father is ready to put the child’s needs before his own.

What might a Prince of Peace do for me? We live in a troubled world where we see violence in many places. We need peace. We often have turmoil in our own personal lives---perhaps it involves relationships or a job or a health issue. We do need peace. I think, too, of so many people who suffer from depression or are coping with mental illness who long for peace. Yes, we need peace in so many areas of our lives.

Some gifts can be wrapped! Let us enjoy those gifts! (I hope it fits-----and you don’t have too many ‘unhappy returns’!!) At this time of year my father, who grew up during the Great Depression, would tell us that the best Christmas gift he ever received was a ‘belt’----and that was because he did not think he would get any gift that year----there was no money.

Some gifts cannot be wrapped..... let us receive the gifts of Jesus, Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever and Prince of Peace-----throughout the coming year.


Stormy Weather and Daily Mass

We are grateful for your generosity. We ask every household to consider contributing to the Annual Collection (as you are able)----your participation is valued. Again, thank you!

Debt Reduction Monthly Collection

As mentioned in an earlier bulletin we will begin a monthly 'debt reduction' collection----through our 'budget envelope' system (and those donations can also be made 'on line'). Our debt to the Diocese of Providence for the church, parish center and rectory is just over two million dollars. We are paying interest and principal every month. Under the current plan we will have a mortgage for the next twenty years. The new monthly collection is meant to do several things: (1) to remind us of the reality of our debt---it is easy to forget when we walk into church each week and the lights are on and there is heat (or air conditioning) (2) it is an opportunity to help 'pay down the debt' in fewer than twenty years. Wouldn't it be great to be done with our mortgage in 18 years or 16 years or 12 years or.....? For those who are able, we are so very grateful for your generosity. (3) those who are new to the parish since the church and parish center were opened now have a way to help with the debt---as they enjoy the facilities we have, they can assist with the cost---now that they are part of the parish family. (4) I think we would agree that we want to do what we can now so that we do not pass on the debt to our children and grandchildren.
