Ponderings

January 22nd is designated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as a “Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.” There are a number of activities that are sponsored by our diocesan Respect Life Office to remind us of the dignity of every human life.

I came across the following statistics recently on the topic of the health of our children (on a yearly basis): worldwide approximately 1 million children die as a result of war; 3.1 million children die as a result of hunger; 1.2 million children die as a result of disease (i.e., pneumonia, malaria, etc.); and then the most startling statistic---approximately 42.6 children die through abortion.

The U.S. bishops put forward a “Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities: A Campaign in Support of Life” (this happened a quarter of a century ago!). The document clearly states, “Among important issues involving the dignity of human life with which the church is concerned, abortion necessarily plays a central role.” The Gospel of Life states, “Today, when human rights are proudly proclaimed and the value of life itself given public affirmation, the most basic of all human rights, ‘the very right to life,’ is being denied or trampled upon, especially at the more significant moments of existence: the moment of birth and the moment of death.” The document goes on to say that the large number of abortions each year (over a million each year in our country) cannot but diminish respect for life in other areas. There is a linkage between abortion and so many other ways that we as a society do not uphold the dignity of all human life. Focusing on abortion is necessary since the unborn child is so vulnerable, since it is so widespread and since it impacts our ‘view’ of all life and its value.

So, what does the pastoral plan do? The plan calls upon all the resources of the Church---people, services and institutions to put their efforts into four major areas.

1. Public Information and Education. Much needs to continue to be done to deepen our understanding of the sanctity of human life and the humanity of unborn children. In a culture which St. John Paul II called the “culture of death” we need to educate and promote a ‘Culture of Life’.

2. Pastoral Care. We need to help women with problems related to pregnancy; for all who have been involved in abortion; for those who are disabled, sick and dying and their families and caregivers; for those who have lost loved ones to violent crime; and for those in prison sentenced to death. Pastoral care is needed for everyone-----and yet, some are in greater need. The Church is called to help with a variety of resources.

3. Public Policy. Every diocese in the U.S. has a person who is the ‘point person’ to advise the bishop about the ever-changing landscape of what is happening in the public square when it comes to ‘pro-life’ issues. Efforts continue to be made to protect the lives of unborn children. In addition, the Church is concerned about those vulnerable to pressure to end their lives by assisted suicide.

4. Prayer and Worship. We need to continue to pray as a community and as individuals that the culture of death that surrounds us today will be replaced by a culture of life and love.

The document concludes in this way, “We hold in high esteem all who proclaim and serve the Gospel of Life. Through their peaceful activism, education, prayer and service, they witness to God’s truth and embody our Lord’s command to love one another as he loves us. We assure them of our continuing prayers. And we renew our appeal to all in the Catholic community to join with them and with us in building a ‘Culture of Life.’”

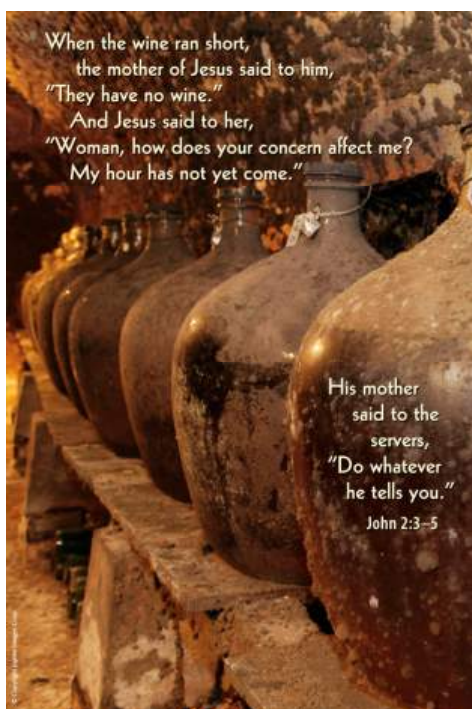
