Ponderings

You have seen the announcement in the bulletin about “Taking the Synod Survey” ---which may have left you with more than a few questions. I do encourage you to take the survey on-line-----everyone in the diocese can take the survey. Dioceses around the world are engaging in similar activities. I thought I would take the next few “Ponderings” columns to provide a bit more information about the Synod that Pope Francis has initiated.

What is a synod? The word ‘synod’ comes from the Greek word ‘synodos’ which is comprised of two root words, ‘syn’ meaning ‘together’ and hodos, meaning the way, path or journey.’ One definition for the word ‘synod’ then is ‘journey together.’ Where are we journeying together? In the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus say, “I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.” The Greek word for ‘the way’ is ‘hodos.’ Where should our journey be headed? We journey together, following Jesus Christ, prompted by the Holy Spirit, toward God the Father.

The Church has long used the term ‘synod’ to refer to a gathering of bishops or priests who come together to discuss matters of doctrine or ecclesiastical life. In 1965 Pope Paul VI established the Synod of Bishops that would meet every few years. The next Synod planned for 2023 with the theme, “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission” will be the 16th ordinary synod since 1965. In preparation for this Synod, Pope Francis has outlined several phases, including a diocesan phase which began on Sunday, October 17, 2021, with Bishop Tobin celebrating Mass at the Cathedral.

According to the International Theological Commission in “Synodality in the Life and Mission of the Church” synodality is the way of ‘living and operating’ of the Church, the People of God, which reveals and gives substance to her being as a communion when all her members journey together, gather in assembly and take an active part in her evangelizing mission.’ The idea of synods is not something new; synods emerged from the early Church and the 2021-2023 synod process is not simply ‘another program’. Therefore, ‘having a synod’ is just part of synodality---a way of being Church, not just an event or program.

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the prayer “Adsumus Sanctae Spiritus” ---translated, “We stand before You, Holy Spirit!” which was historically used at Councils, Synods and other Church gatherings for hundreds of years, attributed to St. Isidore of Seville. The prayer printed below calls on the Holy Spirit to guide us in this ‘synodal way.’

We stand before You, Holy Spirit,
as we gather together in Your name.
With You alone to guide us,
make Yourself at home in our hearts;
Teach us the way we must go
and how we are to pursue it.
We are weak and sinful;
do not let us promote disorder.
Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path
nor partiality influence our actions.
Let us find in You our unity
so that we may journey together to eternal life
and not stray from the way of truth
and what is right.
All this we ask of You,
who are at work in every place and time,
in the communion of the Father and the Son,
forever and ever. Amen.


