Ponderings

Did you take the Synod Survey online yet? As mentioned in the previous “Ponderings” column I will use this forum to write more about the Synod that Pope Francis has initiated with various phases (2021-2023).

In the “Preparatory Document” our Holy Father writes, “It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium.” The journey, which follows in the wake of the Church’s ‘renewal’ proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our ‘journeying together’ is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God.

The document goes on to list the main objectives, which manifest synodality as the form, the style and the structure of the Church;

--recalling how the Spirit has guided the Church’s journey through history and, today, calls us to be, together, witnesses of God’s love;

--living a participative and inclusive ecclesial process that offers everyone—especially those who for various reasons find themselves on the margins--the opportunity to express themselves and to be heard in order to contribute to the edification of the People of God.

--recognizing and appreciating the wealth and the variety of the gifts and charisms that the Spirit liberally bestows for the good of the community and the benefit of the entire human family;

--exploring participatory ways of exercising responsibility in the proclamation of the Gospel and in the effort to build a more beautiful and habitable world;

--examining how responsibility and power are lived in the Church as well as structures by which they are managed, bringing to light and trying to convert prejudices and distorted practices that are not rooted in the Gospel;

--accrediting the Christian community as a credible subject and reliable partner in paths of social dialogue, healing, reconciliation, inclusion and participation, the reconstruction of democracy, the promotion of fraternity and social friendship;

--regenerating relationships among members of Christian communities as well as between communities and other social groups

--fostering the appreciation and appropriation of the fruits of recent synodal experiences on the universal, regional, national and local levels.

The first phase of the Synod is a ‘listening and consulting the People of God’ phase. That is what is taking place in dioceses around the world. The “Synod Survey” is practical way for ‘listening and consulting’----for inviting and engaging members of parishes to participate.

In my next “Ponderings” I will highlight some of the historical context for the Synod and why Pope Francis believes this is important to take into consideration as we begin this process. He quotes from the documents of Vatican II when he states we need to “scrutinize the signs of the time and interpret them in the light of the Gospel.”


Soup-er Bowl! (Super Bowl!) **Outreach to help the Poor**
