Ponderings

If you have read the last two columns you know that we have been exploring what the Synod on Synodality is all about!

In the preparatory document we read, “The synodal journey unfolds within a historical context marked by epochal changes in society and by a crucial transition in the life of the Church, which cannot be ignored: it is within the folds of the complexity of this context, in its tensions and contradictions, that we are called to ‘scrutinize the signs of the times and interpret them in the light of the Gospel’ (Gaudium et Spes, no. 4).

Our Holy Father goes on to say that the global tragedy of the Covid-19 pandemic “momentarily revived the sense that we are a global community, all in the same boat, where one person’s problems are the problems of all. Once more we realized that no one is saved alone; we can only be saved together.” (Fratelli Tutti, no. 32)

Even with this universal experience we know that the Church faces unique situations in various countries around the world. Alongside countries where the Church welcomes the majority of the population and represents a cultural reference point for the whole of society, there are others where Catholics are a minority; in some of these countries, Catholics, together with other Christians, experience forms of persecution, including some very violent ones, and not infrequently martyrdom. If, on the one hand, a secularized mentality tends to expel religion from the public space, on the other hand, religious fundamentalism, without respect for the liberties of others, feeds forms of intolerance and violence that are also reflected in the Christian community and in its relations with society.

Within this context, of some common experiences, but also with experiences that are very unique, synodality represents the main road for the Church, called to renew herself under the action of the Holy Spirit and by listening to the Word. The ability to imagine a different future for the Church and her institutions, in keeping with the mission she has received, depends largely on the decision to initiate processes of listening, dialogue and community discernment, in which each and every person can participate and contribute. The document continues, “At the same time, the decision to ‘journey together’ is a prophet sign for the human family, which needs a shared project capable of pursuing the good of all. A Church capable of communion and fraternity, of participation and subsidiarity, in fidelity to what she proclaims, will be able to stand beside the poor and the least and lend them her own voice. In order to ‘journey together’ we need to let ourselves be educated by the Spirit to a truly synodal mentality, entering with courage and freedom of heart into a conversion process that is indispensable for the ‘continual reformation of which (the Church) always has need, in so far as she is a human institution.’”

The document points out that ‘synodality’---or ‘journeying together’----was the ordinary way the Church conducted business. The document states, “In the first millennium, ‘journeying together---that is, practicing synodality---was the ordinary way in which the Church, understood as “people united in the unity of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” acted.

We will continue in future columns to explore the meaning of ‘synodality’ and how we might ‘journey together’ as a church in the years ahead.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations



A gentle reminder that Church law requires abstinence from meat, meat soups or other dishes made from meat (for those 14 and older) on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. In addition, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are fast days. Adults between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less: that means, take no solid food between meals and only one meal that day should be a full one. Those with special health restrictions should always follow their doctor's advice before fasting.
