Ponderings

As I am writing this column about the situation in Ukraine, please note that the bulletin is sent to the printer on Wednesday. What I write about here will not be totally ‘up-to-date’ with new things happening every day in this conflict.

I thought I would focus on some of what the ‘church news agencies’ are reporting about how the church and religious institutions are coping with the current conflict.

On February 27th Pope Francis said his heart was ‘broken’ by the war in Ukraine and he pleaded again, ‘silence the weapons.’ At that same time Pope Francis had phoned Ukrainian President Volodymr Zelenskyy. In a tweet, Zelenskyy thanked Pope Francis, “for praying for peace in Ukraine and a cease-fire. The Ukrainian people feel the spiritual support of his Holiness.” The phone call came the day after the Holy Father made the diplomatically unusual gesture of going to the Russian Embassy to the Holy See to express his concern about the war. Usually, a head of state would have an ambassador come to him. In a statement after the pope’s embassy visit, the Ukrainian Catholic Church said Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk of Kyiv-Halych “hopes the meeting represents a further push for dialogue to prevail over force. The Ukrainian people, who are defending themselves courageously, cry to the world, ‘stop the war’”.

Pope Francis also remembered the Ukrainians in the bunkers and those fleeing the war, especially “the elderly, those seeking refuge in these hours, mothers fleeing with their children. They are our brothers and sisters for whom humanitarian corridors must be opened as a matter of urgency and who must be welcomed.”

In addition, the Catholic bishops’ conference of Russia has called on political leaders to end the conflict with Ukraine. The bishops of the five dioceses in Russia said, “we call upon all the politicians on whom this decision depends to do decisively everything to end this conflict.” There are fewer than 800,000 Catholics in Russia, comprising roughly 0.5% of the 144 million population, which is mostly Russian Orthodox. The bishops asked Russian Catholics to devote themselves to intensified prayers and fasting for the preservation of human lives, especially on March 2, Ash Wednesday, in response to Pope Francis’ appeal to Catholics worldwide.

The president of Poland’s Catholic bishops’ conference appealed to Poles to show ‘open and hospitable hearts’ to refugees from Ukraine. He said, “In this situation....I appeal to my compatriots to have open and hospitable hearts for refugees from Ukraine who will want to find sanctuary in Poland. Everyone has the right to live in peace and security. Everyone has the right to seek for themselves and their loved ones conditions that will ensure a secure life.”

Polish religious and clergy working in the country have refused to leave Ukraine. There are an estimated 300 religious and diocesan clergy from Poland in Ukraine. “We have a brother from Ukraine that will be ordained in three months and was supposed to leave then for Ukraine, but he asked me to go now,” Father Lukasz Wisniewski, the Dominican provincial in Poland said. “He wants to be with his people.” He continues, “Yesterday I was on the phone with our brothers in Ukraine the entire morning---they all declared they are staying.” There are 25 brothers in the Vicariate of Ukraine, which is part of the Polish Dominican province.

Capuchin Brother Tomasz Zak of the Franciscan Capuchins said, “we have 36 brothers in Ukraine, most are Polish and Ukrainian, but there are also a few Russians. One of them, our Russian brother, just left with the Ukrainian army as their chaplain.”

Let us continue to pray for the cause of peace in this entire region.



Monsignor Kieran E. Harrington serves as the National Director of the Pontifical Missions Societies in the United States, having been appointed in April 2021 by Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, prefect of the Vatican Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. The Pontifical Mission Societies includes the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, the Holy Childhood Association, the Society of St. Peter Apostle, and the Missionary Union of Priests and Religious. The Societies are under the Direction of Pope Francis and support missionary work, foster prayer and awareness, and combat poverty, disease, and injustice. Monsignor Harrington was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Brooklyn in 2001. He was appointed Vicar for Communications for the Diocese of Brooklyn in 2006. In that role, he was responsible for overseeing the diocesan public information office, government affairs and public policy office, NET, the Diocese of Brooklyn cable TV station, and the Diocesan newspaper, The Tablet. He was appointed Rector of the Co-Cathedral of Saint Joseph in 2008. In 2009, he was named president and chairman of the DeSales Media Group, the communications arm of the Diocese. Monsignor graduated with honors from St. John's University with a degree in philosophy and holds a Master of Divinity degree from the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception, Huntington, New York and a Master of Business Administration from New York University's Stern School of Business. He is the recipient of the St. Thomas More Award from the Catholic Lawyers Guild and the Father Mychal Judge Award from the Great Irish Fair in Brooklyn. He is a Knight of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre, a Knight of Columbus, and a member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians.
