Ponderings

These early days of July provide at least two “ponderings” that I share with you. The first is our celebration of the Fourth of July. The second is “July 1st” ----it is the day that I begin my third year as pastor of St. Bernard.

First: The Fourth of July. I hope that it is a nice day----a time to relax and spend time with family and friends. I also hope it is a time to stop and give thanks for the many freedoms we enjoy and to express gratitude for the lives of those who fought in the American Revolutionary War. Recently, I was in upstate New York and had the chance to drive through the National Park that is the Battlefield of Saratoga. I was a teacher of European history (in my former life) but I have two older brothers who were American history teachers! The visit to Saratoga and my conversations with them made me aware that the Battle of Saratoga was a turning point in the war. I tried to imagine young men, mostly farmers, who left their homes and set out to fight a battle that would one day give us Independence and the chance to enjoy July 4th, 2022.

Second: July 1st marks the start of my third year as pastor of St. Bernard. I very much enjoy serving as your pastor. I am grateful for the parish staff, for many volunteers and for all of you. One of the key decisions any institution has to make is whether it will embrace “maintenance” or “mission”. If it opts for “maintenance” then everything will remain the same and the institution will have a slow and painless demise. If it chooses “mission” then there is room to grow, room to be creative, room to engage people in pursing the mission. This requires commitment, energy, participation, compassion, and courage-----not just on the part of the pastor, but for all of us! I want St. Bernard to be a parish ‘on mission’----to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. One catholic author writing about parishes coined the phrase, “Intentional Disciples” ----we need to be intentional in living out our faith and to contribute to the life of the parish. Is it possible that every member of the parish can be intentional, invested, committed, involved.....?” I hope so! Let us embrace “mission” and not “maintenance”

Jesus sent his disciples out on mission-----and he sends us out on mission, also, so that by word and deed we may proclaim the Good News of Salvation. Might our mission even be considered “revolutionary”-----look again at the commitment reflected in the language of those quotes. I think the brave heroes of the American Revolution were indeed ‘intentional’.

Thank you for your contributions to our regular Maintenance Collections. There are, of course, regular maintenance needs. In addition, there are other expenses that are necessary and occur on a less-than-regular basis. For example, we recently had to update the control system for the HVAV system. The computer system that operates our heating and air-conditioning was obsolete. It has been replaced at a cost of \$8,688. Also, we recently had the AED (the portable defibrillators) inspected and we needed to replace the batteries. The cost: \$762. Your generosity helps us to stay 'well-maintained'!

I am grateful to the members of this committee who have expertise in the area of 'buildings and grounds' and provide good advice to me and the Finance Council.
