Ponderings

I recently had a conversation with someone about the unusual names given to ‘groups’ of animals, birds and fish. After doing a little research I discovered the following: Animal group names date back to medieval times when a list of collective terms for animals first appeared in The Book of Saint Albans, printed in 1486. This book, written by a nun named Juliana Barnes, covered the topics of hunting, fishing, and coat of arms, and it also included the first ever list of collective nouns for every type of animal one could imagine. Originally, the nouns were used primarily as hunting terms, but they have since extended into the everyday vernacular.

Here are a few. (Some will make you smile, maybe even giggle, if not laugh out loud!)

So----did you smile, giggle, laugh?

How about a group of Catholics? An assembly. A congregation. People of God.

While we can and do pray to God alone, we are called to be a “group” of believers. The Letter to the Hebrews says, “And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another....” (Hebrews 10:24-25.)

One writer has suggested the following reasons for our “group” or “corporate” worship: (1) We can encourage one another. How important this is for us when we have fallen or are in a ‘low place’ in our faith life. (2) To hold each other accountable. Coming together keeps me more disciplined when I know others will be holding me accountable. (3) Corporate worship is important. If corporate worship is genuine then it is something I cannot duplicate when by myself. Corporate worship enhances my own private time of worship and prayer. (4) God has called us to be part of the “Body of Christ.” If I am not part of the Body, and serving the Body, then I may be hurting the Body in some way. If I am not part of the Body I am like an ‘eye’ that has nobody to provide sight for or to receive support from.

How important it is then, to come together as a ‘group’ to worship together! A bale, a fever, a slaughter, a hover, a streak, a wake, a scurry (wait a minute----those are animal groups)----we are the People of God, the Body of Christ.....keep coming back to worship together!

You may notice that our landscaper has begun the substantial project of clearing out the three “wetlands” areas on the property. DEM has told us that we must clear these areas of any ‘growth’ so that the water can flow freely through these areas. (During this summer of drought there is very little water in them). This project is costly----this is the first time we are clearing them. Going forward we will do an annual ‘maintenance clearing’ of brush from these areas.

Bible Study: The Psalms.

This fall we will offer a 6-session Bible Study focusing on The Psalms. Why the Psalms? A few reasons: (1) Jesus prayed the Psalms. (2) The Psalms are the most often quoted Old Testament book in the New Testament (3) The Psalms are prayed at every Mass----either recited or sung (4) The Psalms can help us with our personal prayer---the Psalms, for example express ‘thanksgiving’ and ‘petition’ and ‘sorrow’. In addition to helping us understand a Book of Sacred Scripture, a study of the Psalms will help us understand Jesus better and ‘prayer’ better. We will use a book entitled, Psalm Basics for Catholics, by John Bergsma. Please purchase this book to use in the program. (On-line book sellers have it) No previous ‘Bible Study’ is required.
