## Ponderings

You may have heard the maxim, “The blood of martyrs is the seed of Christians”---it is attributed to Tertullian, a second century priest. Down through the centuries we know that the blood of the martyrs has indeed encouraged the faith of others. We think to ourselves, “If someone would give their life for what they believe---maybe I should take my faith more seriously.” We might also tend to think that martyrs only existed in another time and in another country. That is why the feast we celebrate on October 19<sup>th</sup> is so helpful for us.

On October 19<sup>th</sup> we celebrate the Feast of the North American Martyrs---St. John de Brebeuf, Isaac Jogues and companions. Eight Jesuit missionaries came to the “New World” in the 17<sup>th</sup> century to work among the indigenous people in the remote areas of what is now New York state and eastern Canada. There were six priests and two oblate laymen. They were canonized saints through their heroic missionary efforts between 1625-1649. Each of these missionaries had heard about the difficult conditions they would encounter, but none could possibly have imagined the disease, severe weather, the lack of food, unsanitary living conditions, solitude and a hostile population that they would encounter. Travel was by canoe on treacherous waterways or walking through miles of dense insect filled and uncharted forests. The indigenous people spoke a different language.

The Huron nation was made up of 20,000 to 30,000 people. They lived mostly in the interior of Canada. They were generally hospitable to the missionaries---but could be suspicious of the “Black Robes”—the Jesuits and their religion. They also ministered to the Iroquois, who hated the Hurons and the French. The French were the trade partners with the Hurons.

The first of these Jesuits, Fr. John de Brebeuf, arrived in New France in 1625. He was the founder of the Huron mission and has been referred to as the Apostle of the Hurons. He worked here as a missionary for 24 years. He prepared a catechism in their language. He was put to death in a most violent manner. Fr. Isaac Jogues, another of the Jesuit martyrs, is unique. He lost some fingers and a thumb after being tortured. He survived. He was imprisoned and used as a slave for 13 months. He escaped and made his way back to France. Because of his mutilated fingers and the lack of a thumb, he believed the Church would not allow him to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ. Pope Urban VII, however, made an exception for the courageous priest, and in 1646 Fr. Jogues eagerly returned to New France where he met his martyrdom.

Their companions included Oblate John Lalande, Oblate Rene Goupil, Fr. Anthony Daniel, Fr. Gabriel Lalemant, Fr. Charles Garnier and Fr. Noel Chabanel.

Around the world, even in our own day, missionaries face challenging pastoral assignments. In recent months and years, these men and women have faced violence, kidnapping and death. The blood of the martyrs continues to be the seed of the Christians.

Has your faith been inspired by the Martyrs of our Church?
