Ponderings

“Carol of the Bells” is a popular Christmas carol. The music is based on a four-note ostinato and is in 3/4 time signature, with the B-flat bell pealing in 6/8 time. It has a unique origin! The song is based on the Ukrainian folk chant called “Shchedryk” by composer Mykola Leontovych. The song title means “the little swallow” in English. This folk song is about a sparrow that flies into a home and sings to the family about the bountiful year that awaits them. It was not originally a Christmas tune, rather it is a song that celebrates New Year’s. It was first performed in Ukraine on the night of January 13, 1916. Although the date is 12 days after the New Year’s Day on the Gregorian calendar, the Orthodox churches in Ukraine used the Julian calendar. According to that calendar, January 13, 1916 was considered New Year’s Eve.

In the United States, “Shchedryk” was first performed on October 5, 1921 at Carnegie Hall by the Alexander Koschetz’s Ukrainian National Chorus. Peter J. Wilhousky was a popular composer and choral conductor at the time who was of Ukrainian ethnic origin. When he heard “Shchedryk” he decided to write new lyrics in English to accompany the song’s new melody in 1936. He rearranged the melody for orchestra with new lyrics for NBC radio network’s symphony orchestra, centered around the theme of bells because the melody reminded him of hand bells which begins, “Hark! How the bells.” It was first aired during the Great Depression. Its initial popularity stemmed from Wilhousky’s ability to reach a wide audience in his role as arranger for the NBC Symphony Orchestra. It is now strongly associated with Christmas because of its new lyrics, which reference bells, caroling and the line ‘merry, merry, merry Christmas. His song is what we know as the “Carol of the Bells”. As the name implies, it is about the sound of bells at Christmas time. The song attempts to bring hope to its listeners during the dark winter months. It is a song that can easily lift us up during this season of the year.

The original folk song version was composed during the atrocities of the First World War. Now, with another tragic war raging in Ukraine the song, now the “Carol of the Bells” might just be a song of hope and a prayer for those who desperately want an end to the fighting---for those longing to be re-united with loved ones.

Carol of the Bells

Hark! How the bells
Sweet silver bells
All seem to say,
‘Throw cares away.’
Christmas is here
Bringing good cheer
To young and old
Meek and the bold

Ding, dong, ding, dong
That is their song
With joyful ring
All caroling
One seems to hear
Words of good cheer

From everywhere
filling the air

Oh how they pound
Raising the sound,
O'er hill and dale,
Telling the tale
Gaily they ring
While people sing
Songs of good cheer
Christmas is here
Merry, merry, merry, merry Christmas
Merry, merry, merry, merry Christmas

These few verses might help you recall the tune! It struck me that a folk tune from Ukraine that spoke of the hope of the New Year, has for many decades help raise our spirits at Christmas. Let us continue to pray that the Prince of Peace, Jesus, Emmanuel will inspire hearts the world over to work for peace----to end war, violence, terrorism and conflicts of all kinds. We long to hear “words of good cheer”.
