Ponderings

We recently had our parish celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Henning. It was great to welcome him to our parish. Those at the Mass enjoyed his engaging homily and after Mass met in the Parish Center for refreshments and photos with the bishop. He was gracious in spending as much time as families needed to get the ‘perfect photo’!

At around this same time I came upon a bulletin from the Vatican about Pope Francis meeting a group of young people from Genoa (in northern Italy) who had received the Sacrament of Confirmation. He said to them, “.....they say that Confirmation is the ‘farewell Sacrament’. The young person receives Confirmation, then goes away from the Church, is this true or not? (they reply: No!). No, good, this is a great thing, to stay. Because with the strength of Confirmation you go forward, you go forward not only in the Church, but in your own life, each one of us, because Confirmation prepares us to become good people, good citizens, good Christians. Ahead with this.”

I found it interesting that even from the “highest authority”----our Holy Father, there is an awareness of how Confirmation can be viewed by some people---as the ‘farewell Sacrament’. I know that it is true in many places in our country----young people receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and then think they have ‘graduated’ or that they are ‘finished’. I like to tell them that Confirmation is really a ‘launching pad’-----the place from which they can live their faith in a mature, adult manner.

Pope Francis continued his address to the young people of Genoa, “And one thing that comes to mind, a word: ‘to conserve’. Because Confirmation is a gift, take care of the gift, do you not understand? This gift must not be put away in a drawer, no: conserve it in your heart. And how is it conserved? First of all with prayer, asking the Lord to give us the strength to go forward, that this strength of the Holy Spirit that we have all received may be conserved. And praying always, because the Lord said that if you ask, you will receive. But at times we do not ask. We forget to ask, to pray.....so, we must pray and insist that the Lord listen to us and give us the strength to keep going forward.”

As a parish, let us pray for our young people and their families----those who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Let us pray that they may stay connected to the our parish, to the Church. We are a community that wants to support them! Pope Francis says, “....in the Church we are not ‘me alone’, me and God, no we are all of us, in community.”

Can we beat the odds? Can we defy the statistics? The book we are reading in our book club entitled, Return: How to Draw Your Child Back to the Church, says that statistically speaking, approximately 50% of young people will leave the church by the age of 24. And of the 50% who remain, only a small percentage will be regular in the ‘practice of the faith’. Startling. Frightening statistics. Our young people need support and encouragement to stay connected. We have quite a few young people who have ‘gotten involved’ in parish life----as catechists, lectors and eucharistic ministers. We have a group of young people going to Steubenville East this summer---a large Catholic youth rally in Springfield that brings together young people from New England and upstate New York---this positive experience which includes talks, Mass, Adoration, Confession, musical performances, community-building activities----tells the young people----you are members of the Church, of your parish communities---valued, important, and filled with talents and abilities that the Holy Spirit empowers you to share. May the Holy Spirit help our young people to deepen their friendship with Jesus Christ and so remain connected to his Body, the Church.
