Ponderings

Happy Father's Day. We thank all our 'fathers, grandfathers, godfathers, uncles, stepfathers, father-figures'----all who have taken that role of father in the family. Fathers have always been important in the lives of their families---each age has presented its challenges for fathers and our own age is no exception. Whenever I write about family relationships (mothers, fathers, sons, daughters) I like to preface what I write by saying that none of them were or are perfect---they have their flaws and weaknesses, as we all do. Some of us have had a 'positive relationship' with our fathers and yet I also know that some of those 'father relationships' were not positive.

What I do think is 'timeless' is the father's role in helping his family in their life of faith. The father models what is important. An earthly father helps his family look to our Heavenly Father. How important it is, then, that fathers keep an active, healthy faith life. How important it is that our fathers receive the sacraments, come to Mass, take time to pray, engage in works of charity----they are growing in their own life of faith----receiving that source of strength that our Heavenly Father alone can give us, and they are modeling a good behavior for their families. We transmit values to our families by what we say, but perhaps equally important, we transmit those values by what we do. If fathers take time to pray for their children----and the children, see their father praying for them----those children will begin to understand that there is someone 'bigger than dad'----God the Father. To our fathers----have you thought about joining the Knights of Columbus or our St. Joseph's Men's Group----gatherings that can support your efforts to keep the 'fire of faith burning' in your life.

The young Karol Woytyla, the future Holy Father, Pope John Paul II lost his mother when he was nine years old. Young Karol was largely raised by his father. He recalls waking up in the early hours before dawn and seeing the figure of his father kneeling, deeply absorbed in prayer. This example of his father left an indelible impression on his young son.

A second 'timeless' quality of the father's role is the love he has for his wife. The love of husband and wife is meant for their own joy and for bringing new life into the world. How is it possible to keep a vibrant life of love of friendship going year after year? How can a husband and wife keep that loving relationship from becoming stagnant? The desire to keep the love and intimacy of married life must be intentional and be undertaken with both words and actions. One key element is the sharing of a faith life with each other. Do husband and wife share the fruits of their prayers? Do husbands and wives pray with and for each other? Do husbands and wives come to worship together? Am I crazy to think that it is possible that a husband and wife driving home from Mass just might talk about something that 'struck them'---the readings, the music, the homily (□)?

A third 'timeless' quality of the father's role is the love he has for his children. Do fathers see their children as a precious treasure from God, entrusted to them. I cannot help but think of the old phrase: 'roots and wings'. We give our children 'roots'---values, chief among them, our religious values. Fathers (and mothers) also give their children 'wings'----the skills and abilities to navigate the world, to enter new experiences---school, college, work---with independence and confidence. The earthly father is meant to convey the 'unconditional love' of our Heavenly Father. Yes, it is painful in a family when a child 'makes a mistake'; 'messes up'; 'makes bad choices'---how important it is to convey a love that does not end.

I recall conducting a Baptism preparation class when I was a deacon at St. Matthew's in Cranston. Two young fathers (who had been high school classmate) were now meeting up again year later---now in their new role as fathers. One said to the other, "It changes your whole life." "Yes, it does," the other replied. Being a father changes your whole life---thank you fathers.

Mission 150

Sacraments of Initiation for Adults?

Yes! Adults do receive the Sacraments of Initiation. On Pentecost Sunday four adults from the parish received Sacraments of Initiation: Hayden Almeida, Jennifer Horsfield, Thomas Wilkinson, and Timothy Schartner. Two of the adults were "received into the Church"---having been baptized in a different church. Both of them received Holy Communion for the first time as Catholics. All four of them received the sacrament of Confirmation. Each has had their own unique faith journey, which, through the prompting of the Holy Spirit---brought them to ask questions like these: "How do I become Catholic?" "How do I make my Confirmation?"
