Ponderings

Much of the world was captivated by the recent story of the four Colombian children, one a baby, who survived a plane crash and forty days lost in the Amazon jungle. The children are all siblings, ages 13, 9, 4 and 11 months. The children went missing after a plane crash that happened early on May 1st when a Cessna single-engine propeller plane that had six passengers aboard it as well as a pilot declared an emergency due to an engine failure on the plane. After the emergency declaration, the aircraft fell off of the radar and the search for the plane and the passengers began. A search team discovered the plane and recovered the bodies of three adults in the rainforest on May 16th, but could not locate the children.

The four siblings were on the plane with their mother and the group was traveling from the Amazonian village of Araracuara to San Jose del Guaviare in central Columbia. The children are members of the Huitoto people, an Indigenous group in southeastern Colombia, and the older children had some survival skills, officials said. The government of Colombia sent 150 soldiers with a team of 10 Belgian shepherd dogs into the area of the rainforest. There were also approximately 200 volunteers from various Indigenous tribes in the area who aided in the search. In more dense parts of the jungle, soldiers dropped food from helicopters to help the children survive. Multiple planes also flew over the jungle and fired flares to help people searching for the children in the jungle at night. There were also speakers that played a message from the children's grandmother, who encouraged them to stay put as opposed to continuously moving.

As the days searching for the children continued, the soldiers found multiple items that made them think the siblings were still alive in the jungle, including footprints, diapers, a baby bottle and chewed fruit. Ultimately, the children were found by a rescue dog first. On Friday, the 9th army radios crackled into life. "Miracle, miracle, miracle, miracle." It was the army code for a child found alive; repeated four times it meant all four had survived, in a remarkable feat of resilience. They were taken out of the jungle by helicopter. Locating the children was the combined efforts of the Indigenous communities and the Colombian military, but the siblings ultimately kept themselves alive for the 40 days.

On June 9th the children were transported to a Bogota hospital to be checked out. It was reported that the children suffered from dehydration and were first treated by military paramedics. The children, whose names are Lesly, Soleiny, Tien and Cristin have mosquito bites and showed signs of exhaustion. "They've given us an example of total survival that will go down in history," said Colombia's president, Gustavo Petro, calling it "a joy for the whole country."

A child saved, a child rescued, a child recovered----yes, we should shout 'miracle'. This story certainly was heart-warming. Our hearts go out to children who are lost----they are so vulnerable.

As men and women who believe in the dignity of all human life, we pray that the same intensity by so many people might be extended to the 'unborn'----that those children might be 'saved, rescued and recovered'----and that keeping that child alive might be a goal we all have and one that gives us great joy when we witness the miracle of their birth. We need to take a step back----recognize the human life in the womb----marshal our resources to protect the unborn----and witness a miracle.




Men's Clothing Drive
