Ponderings

Happy Fourth of July! On June 14th we celebrated Flag Day and now as we mark our nation's Independence Day, we will display lots of 'red, white and blue' decorations. It is helpful and interesting to recall some of the history of our American flag. The flag has had a number of changes over the years, but the current design has its roots in one of the first battles of the American Revolution. While fighting British troops who had invaded Boston on January 1, 1776, the United States' newly commissioned general George Washington, ordered a revised version of the British flag to be flown over his camp. This flag showed the traditional British "Union Jack" design in the top right-hand corner (where the stars are in today's flag) and the famous 13 stripes (representing the 13 colonies) appeared for the first time. It can be argued that this was our first 'official' American flag. One flag expert challenges this traditionally held position. He says that the Union Jack was only used by the navy and perhaps at forts. He says, "It was sort of a compromise between the radicals who wanted to see a separate nation and the people who were more conciliatory and wanted to see some accommodation with the crown."

But that flag, known as the Grand Union, was not the first flag to be flown by American soldiers. In skirmishes with British troops before the 1776 siege of Boston, Americans flew a number of flags aimed at rallying morale. The most famous of these pictures a deadly snake on a red background with the words "Don't Tread on Me". Because Americans were determined to separate entirely from England, the Grand Union's use of the British Union Jack did not seem entirely appropriate as the Revolutionary War took full hold throughout 1776. So, Betsy Ross's design does away entirely with the that feature and replaces it with the famous stars. Congress formally adopted Ross's design in early 1777 and it became an American icon until 1794 when new states began entering the Union. On June 14th 1777, Congress passed a resolution stating that 'the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white' and that 'the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation.' Congress modified the design of the flag in 1794 to add two new stars and two new stripes. Then, in 1818, when even more states began coming aboard, Congress made the last major revision of the design: The flag would have 13 stripes again to represent the original colonies, but with each state's arrival, the design would add an additional star.

This tradition has held since, with only very minor modifications (such as the arrangement and position of the stars) being made since then. In 1960, Congress and President Eisenhower agreed to add what has become the last star to the flag. While the colors of the American flag are well known, they didn't actually have an exact meaning until this time. They also formally adopted words for which all three colors are said to represent; red symbolizes Hardiness and Valor, white symbolizes Purity and Innocence and blue represents Vigilance, Perseverance and Justice.

There have been no congressional or presidential proposals since 1960 to further change the design of the flag, and tradition holds that none are likely to be presented unless a new state is added to the Union. Private groups on occasion, have made attempts to convince elected officials to change the flag, but none have attracted serious consideration.

It was almost unheard of for individuals to fly the U.S. flag until the Civil War broke out in 1861, at which time the Stars and Stripes suddenly became a popular symbol in the North. In 1949 President Harry Truman signed legislation designating June 14th as National Flag Day. I suspect that the 'unofficial flag day' is actually July 4th ---when there are many more flags decorating homes, businesses, etc.

Men of St. Joseph


The Men of St. Joseph International is a Catholic association of men committed to Jesus Christ. Our monthly meeting will be held on Wednesday


Men's Clothing Drive
