Ponderings

If I had to give a title to this “Ponderings” it would be “Sports and Religion: Two Very Different Approaches”. The first approach is the controversial decision by the Los Angeles Dodgers to honor a group that calls itself the “Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence” ---ridiculing Catholic religious sisters and Catholic beliefs. The second approach is that of the Oklahoma Sooners’ softball team that recently won the NCAA Women’s College World Series championship. The stories couldn’t be more different!

The Los Angeles Dodgers decision to honor a group of people who blaspheme the catholic church has been very controversial. Archbishop Jose Gomez, the Archbishop of Los Angeles, at a Mass for the Feast of the Sacred Heart recently stated, “The Catholic religion is a religion of love. We believe that God is love, that he has opened his heart to reveal himself to us in Jesus Christ.” He continued, “We prove our love by working for peace and justice for every person. This is why so many of us are offended by the decision to honor a group that insults Jesus and mocks Catholic believers.” The Archbishop wrote, “Religious freedom and the respect for the beliefs of others are hallmarks of our nation. When God is insulted, when the beliefs of any of our neighbors are ridiculed, it diminishes all of us.” “We are teachers and healers. We are advocates for those our society neglects: the poor, the homeless, the prisoner, the unborn, the immigrant.” “We do this because we are Catholics, and we are called to love with the heart of Jesus.” At the conclusion of the Mass, Archbishop Gomez noted the heavy presence of religious sisters and publicly thanked them for their vocation and ministry, which was followed by applause.

The Oklahoma Sooners’ softball team provides us with an example of encouragement and faith. In a media briefing following their 3-1 victory over Florida State to seal their third straight WCWS title, Sooners’ infielder Grace Lyons was quick to explain where true joy comes from. “The only way that you can have a joy that doesn’t fade away is from the Lord. And any other type of joy is actually happiness that comes from circumstances and outcomes.” That joy, Lyons told another reporter, “is really the only thing that can keep you motivated, just in a good mindset no matter the outcomes.... there’s really no other way that softball can bring you that, because of how much failure comes in it, and just how much of a roller coaster the game can be.” Another player said, “I went through that my freshman year. I was so happy that we won the college World Series, but I didn’t feel joy,” she said. “I didn’t know what to do the next day. I didn’t know what to do for that following week. I didn’t feel fulfilled, and I had to find Christ in that.” She continued, “I think that is what makes our team so strong is that we’re not afraid to lose because it’s not the end of the world if we do lose. Yes, obviously, we worked our butts off to be here and we want to win, but it’s not the end of the world, because our life is in Christ and that’s all that matters.”

Another player said, “We’re really fixing our eyes on Christ, and that’s something when, like they were saying, you can’t find a fulfillment in an outcome, whether it is good or bad. We have an eternity of joy with our Father and I’m so excited about that. Yes, I live in the moment, but I know this isn’t my home and no matter what, my sisters in Christ will be there with me in the end when we’re with our King.” Their distinctive way of giving thanks to God is to look to heaven “eyes up” and to point with their two index fingers to heaven----to give God the glory and praise.

A story of ridicule of God and story of gratitude to God.....we do see such extremes in our culture today. Let’s be on the side of those who point to heaven and give thanks!




Save the Date: St. Bernard Parish Feast Picnic: Saturday, August 19th.



Mission 150
