Ponderings

As you know I recently went on vacation to the Azores. I was with another priest and a group of 40 people---for many of us it was our first time visiting those islands. There are many of our neighbors in Rhode Island and Massachusetts that have their roots in the Azores. A terrible earthquake/volcano eruption on the island of Faial in 1957 resulted in a special immigration bill sponsored by Sen. John Kennedy and Sen. John Pastore (Azorean Refugee Act of 1958) which brought many survivors of that natural disaster to southeastern New England. (1500 visas were made available for the victims of the volcanic eruption/earthquake) It is referred to as the ‘Capelinhos eruption’.

One of the important religious images that is deeply imbedded in the faith of the people of these islands is “Senhor Santo Christo”—Lord, Holy Christ. It is a wooden image of Christ by an unknown artist in a Renaissance style. It is a representation of the “Ecce Homo”----"Behold the Man"----the episode in Jesus’ life during the Passion when he was presented to the crowds by Pilate. There is a great contrast between the violence on the body---crown of thorns, bruises, etc. and the serenity of Jesus’ expression. The statue is normally on display in the convent chapel of the main church—Church of Nossa Senhora da Esperanca (Our Lady of Hope) in the capital city of Ponta Delgada on the island of Sao Miguel.

Devotion to the image began in the 17th and 18th centuries. The first procession in honor of the Lord Holy Christ occurred through the initiative of Mother Teresa da Anunciada, with the support of the island population, following a series of earthquakes where the nun hoped to obtain divine intervention. The islands had been experiencing earthquakes and tremors---causing much death, damage and destruction. Following the first procession the tradition continues with an annual procession with the statue. Over the years statue and cape have been adorned with many precious jewels.

This devotion to the Lord Holy Christ quickly spread to the other islands of the Azores. As many Azoreans immigrated to the United States, they brought this devotion with them. Processions with an image of “Santo Christo” take place throughout the summer months in many places, including Fall River and New Bedford. I was told that after the devotion the people of Portugal have for Our Lady of Fatima, the next most important devotion is to Santo Christo.

I learned during my visit that the door to the chapel where the image is housed was opened at 5:30 p.m. every day and people could visit the image/pray in the chapel from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. I found the ‘side door’---not clearly marked! ---where I could enter. I made my way through the garden into the chapel. Several other people came into the chapel around the same time-----they knelt and quietly said their prayers.

I went to visit the image on a second afternoon and sat on a bench in the park across the street from the church since I was about ten minutes early. A man came and sat on the bench and asked if I knew what time they opened the doors. I told him ‘5:30’. I asked where he was from---he said the island of Faial. He was in Sao Miguel on business and was coming to see the image for the first time. I told him it was ironic that an “American tourist” showed him—an Azorean---how to get into the chapel! We both had a good laugh at that! I told him I would have to share this story---which I am now doing!

Our Church has so many rich faith traditions and devotions often associated with various cultures and countries---some of the origins of these devotions, customs and traditions go back many years---and often they are part of the fabric of the lives, the lives of their children and down through the generations. Let us treasure the richness of so many devotions and customs and traditions in our Catholic tradition.




