Ponderings

World Youth Day was just recently held in Lisbon, Portugal. It is the 37th World Youth Day and was originally scheduled for 2022, but was postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. For this year's motto, Pope Francis chose a passage from Luke's Gospel, "Mary arose and went with haste" (LK 1:39) which opens the account of the Visitation, when Mary visits her cousin Elizabeth following the angel's announcement to the Blessed Mother that she would be the mother of the Son of God.

The itinerary was as follows:

Wednesday, August 2nd the pope departed Rome's Fiumicino airport. He was greeted upon his arrival by the President of Portugal, Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa.

Thursday, August 3rd was the welcoming ceremony for the World Youth Day at the Universidade Catolica Portuguesa.

Friday, August 4th was the Way of the Cross with the young people.

Saturday, August 5th—visit to Fatima and the vigil.

Sunday, August 6th—concluding Mass for World Youth Day in Tejo Park.

In one of his homilies the Holy Father had this to say: "Seeing we are surrounded by so many young people, I would like to mention a young person from Lisbon, Saint John Brito, a young native of this place, who centuries ago, amid great hardship, set sail for India and began to speak and dress the same way as the people of the places he went, in order to tell them about Jesus. We too are called to lower our nets these days and to dialogue with everyone, proposing the Gospel message, even if it involves risking a few storms. Like the young people who come here from all over the world to take on the giant waves, we too must set out fearlessly. Indeed, we need never fear the open seas, for in the midst of the storms and battling winds, Jesus comes to meet us and says, 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid' (Mt 14:27). How often have we had this experience?"

For the address at the Welcoming Ceremony he said, "Friends, I want to be clear with you, for you are allergic to falsity and empty words: in the Church, there is room for everyone. Everyone. In the Church, no one is left out or left over. There is room for everyone. Just the way we are. Everyone. Jesus says this clearly. When he sends the apostles to invite people to the banquet which a man had prepared, he tells them: 'Go out and bring in everyone,' young and old, healthy and infirm, righteous and sinner. Everyone, everyone, everyone! IN the Church there is room for everyone."

In his address to the civil authorities he said, "Young people are the future. Yet they encounter much that is disheartening: lack of jobs, the dizzying pace of contemporary life, hikes in the cost of living, the difficulty of finding housing and, even more disturbing, the fear of forming families and bringing children into the world. In Europe and, more generally in the West, we are witnessing a decline in the demographic curve: progress seems to be measured by developments in technology and personal comfort, whereas the future calls for reversing the fall in the birth rate and the weakening of the will to live. A healthy politics can accomplish much in this regard; it can be a generator of hope. It is not about holding on to power, but about giving people the ability to hope."

Much of what happens when Pope Francis travels around the globe is not reported in detail. World Youth Day is a source of great encouragement not only for those who are able to attend, but for the whole church. Our Church is alive with all ages-----and the young were able to hear the inspiring words of our Holy Father----and to be strengthened in their faith by other young people gathered together.

One young woman from Atlanta said, "Being here shows you that being Catholic is not only for old people (*did she mean me?*) and it brings you together and helps you form a community internationally. Everyone is so on fire. It really makes the world feel a lot smaller."




Thank You!
