Ponderings

This week's Ponderings column is really two 'shorter' Ponderings. The first is about World Youth Day, which was recently held in Lisbon. The second is about Maria Lanakila Catholic Church in Maui.

World Youth Day.

In a previous column I included a number of quotes from Pope Francis from his homilies and speeches at World Youth Day held in Lisbon. I recently came across some interesting statistics about that gathering.

1. There were approximately one and a half million young people at this religious event. The planners had predicted 800,000---but they know that when they did a 'count' at the closing mass it was almost double that number.

2. The most numerous delegations were not from Portugal.

Often the 'host country' has the largest contingent of pilgrims. Two countries had more young people there ahead of Portugal. Spain had 77,224 and Italy had 59,469. Portugal was third with 43,742. France was fourth with 42,482 and the United States in fifth place with 19,196. (Travel costs impacted the number of people who traveled from outside of Europe)

3. A great concentration of bishops and priests from around the world

Almost 700 bishops, 30 of them cardinals, and 10,000 priests participated in Lisbon's World Youth Day.

4. There were young people with 'different capabilities' in attendance

A total of 1,753 young people with some sort of disability (intellectual or mobility) participated. Of that total, 135 were deaf and 241 were blind.

5. Volunteers

Approximately 25,000 volunteers assisted with the events of World Youth Day. Interestingly, 8,831 families opened their homes to offer hospitality to 28,618 pilgrims.

6. Journalists

Almost 5,000 journalists were accredited to cover Lisbon's World Youth Day.

7. "Ecologic act"

17,980 trees were planted.

8. Sacrament of Reconciliation

In the Park of Joy, where the Holy Father sat to hear confessions, there were also 2,000 priests hearing confessions almost every day.

Maria Lanakila Catholic Church, Maui

You may have heard of this church with the recent news of the tragic fires and resulting loss of life and property on this Hawaiian Island. This church has been described as a 'miracle' in that it is still standing even after wildfires ravaged its surroundings. Maria Lanakila Catholic Church (the name translates: Our Lady of Victory), located in Lahaina, dates back to 1846, more than 100 years before Hawaii joined the union as the 50th state. While the church and the adjacent rectory appear to remain intact, the roof of the nearby Sacred Heart School blew off. The pastor acknowledges that there may be damage that cannot be seen that will require restoration or even demolition of the building.

Bishop Clarence Silva, the bishop of Honolulu, celebrated Mass at a church about 10 miles away from Maria Lanakila. He read a message from Pope Francis who said he was praying for those who lost loved ones, homes and livelihoods. He also conveyed prayers for first responders. The bishop told the Associated Press that the community is worried about its children, who have witnessed tragedy and are anxious.

More than 2,700 structures were destroyed in Lahaina. The town of Lahaina served as the capital of the Hawaiian monarchy for 25 years in the 19th century before the capital moved to Honolulu. The standing church is a visible sign of the church's presence with the people there who are suffering so very much. 

Gluten-Free Hosts.


