Ponderings

During the week of September 18th, I made my annual retreat at St. Joseph Abbey in Spencer, MA. The monks of the abbey support themselves through the “Holy Rood Guild” ---which makes vestments and through the production of “Trappist Preserves”. You might recall in recent years that the monastery also undertook the project of ‘producing beer’. (Other monasteries around the world produce beer). After a few years of production, they have discontinued the project. Other monasteries make and sell such things as candy (Trappistes in Wrentham, MA); fruitcakes; cheese; bread; honey; candles; notecards---to name a few.

I had gone to the monastery a couple of times before for my retreat but had not been back for about twenty years. If you go on to their website, you can see lots of information about the abbey----including how you can book a retreat. At the present time ‘lay men and lay women’ can make a retreat there. There are options for weekdays and weekends. The retreat house only accommodates about 12 people per retreat session. Basically, you join the monks in their daily schedule of Mass and prayer. (Get ready for early rising----Morning Prayer, followed by Mass begins at 6:00 a.m.). The retreat is ‘silent’----no talking to other retreatants; no talking during meals. The silence is meant to help the person listen on a ‘deeper level’ to the voice of God. So, what do you do during the day? At this retreat house there is a short conference by one of the monks after breakfast. Then, for the rest of the day, besides the posted times of ‘community prayer in the chapel’ you are free to organize your day---reading, prayer, walking---and in general ‘slowing down’.

The retreat house, now located in Spencer, MA had an earlier history in Rhode Island. The order had moved from France to Canada and then in 1899 Fr. John Mary Murphy petitioned the General Chapter of the Order to move the monastery from eastern Nova Scotia to the Diocese of Providence. The small community arrived in New England in the summer of 1900---to a tract of land of some 300 acres in Cumberland, RI---the monastery was called Our Lady of the Valley. The monks set about building their monastery. By 1902 they had their first building erected. The monastery church was completed in 1928; the Chapter and Novitiate wings in 1931 and 1937; and the large Porter’s Lodge in 1938. The buildings were made of gray granite they quarried on their own property. By 1943 there were 84 monks in the community. After World War II there was a resurgence of interest in contemplative life and the number at the Valley and at other monasteries in the United States rose. In 1948 there were 137 monks in Cumberland. A ‘daughter house’ was established in Santa Fe---with 34 monks.

Sadly, on March 21, 1950, the abbey was ravaged by fire and the devastation was virtually complete. The original wing was destroyed, the church was rendered structurally unsound and had to be demolished; and the Chapter wing needed extensive repairs. The community, numbering 140 monks, was homeless.

The monks needed to find a new location. I recall speaking to an elderly monk who had been there when the fire happened, telling me that the soil was very rocky, and the area was becoming more developed with homes being built. They searched for a different location to rebuild. The community purchased a large agricultural property, Alta Crest Farms, in Spencer, MA. The monks set to work adapting the farm buildings for monastic purposes while using an abandoned Civilian Conservation Corps Camp in northern Rhode Island as a temporary home. Despite the austere living conditions, new monks joined---another ‘daughter house’ was established in Berryville, Virginia, Our Lady of the Holy Cross.

On December 23, 1950, eighty monks took possession of St. Joseph’s Abbey, Spencer. Ground was broken for the Abbey Church on March 19, 1952, and hardly a year later the first Mass was celebrated in the new church. There were 156 monks in the community. A third foundation was established in Snowmass, Colorado in 1958 with 35 monks from Spencer as the group to begin the new monastery. In the same year a monastery was established in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Today the community is much smaller than it had been ‘at its height’----with an aging population. They continue to be a witness to the importance of the contemplative life in our church---a life of prayer.
