Ponderings

You may have heard on the news that there is a special meeting going on in Rome at the present time. It is called the Synod on Synodality. So, what's it all about! It is a three-week assembly of church leaders to talk about how the Church needs to 'listen' as we go into the next millennium. Pope Francis said that "the primary task of the synod" is to "refocus our gaze at God, to be a Church that looks mercifully at humanity." Recalling the words of the Lord to St. Francis, our Holy Father said, "Go, rebuild my Church." He continued, "our Mother the Church is always in need of purification, of being 'repaired', for we are a people made up of forgiven sinners.... always in need of returning to the source that his Jesus and putting ourselves back on the paths of the Spirit to reach everyone with is Gospel."

He emphasized that the synod is not 'a political gathering' or a 'polarized parliament' but 'a place of grace and communion.' He addressed those present on October 4th, "Dear brother Cardinals, brother bishops, sisters and brothers, we are at the opening of the General Assembly of the Synod. Here we do not need a purely natural vision, made up of human strategies, political calculation or ideological battles. We are not here to carry out a parliamentary meeting or a plan of reformation. No. We are here to walk together with the gaze of Jesus, who blesses the Father and welcomes those who are weary and oppressed." This Ordinary Synod of Bishops for the first time includes laymen and women as full voting members.

The delegates will be meeting in the Vatican's Paul VI Hall from October 4 through 29 to advise the pope on the theme: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission" The three-week assembly is the first of the two-part Synod on Synodality that will conclude in 2024. In his homily, Pope Francis outlined his vision for a synodal Church, saying Jesus wants 'a church that is united and fraternal.... that listens and dialogues.... that blesses and encourages, that helps those who seek the Lord, that lovingly stirs up the indifferent, that opens paths in order to draw people into the beauty of faith.... that has God as its center and, therefore, is not divided internally and is never harsh externally.' He urged people to imitate St. Francis, who lived at a time of 'great struggles and divisions.... between the institutional Church and heretical currents,' but did not criticize or 'lash out' at anyone, choosing instead to take up 'only the weapons of the Gospel, which are humility and unity, prayer and charity.'

The pope warned of three dangerous temptations facing the Church today: "of being a rigid Church.... which arms itself against the world and looks backwards, of being a lukewarm Church, which surrenders to the fashions of the world, and of being a tired Church, turned in on itself." He continued, "Jesus' blessing gaze invites us to be a Church that does not face today's challenges and problems with a divisive and contentious spirit but, on the contrary, turns its eyes to God who in communion and, with awe and humility, blesses and adores him, recognizing him as its only Lord. We belong to him and---let us remember—we exist only to bring him to the world."

Some other 'particulars'----the 364 delegates are seated at tables of about 12 people, divided into language groups: English, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese and French. Pope Francis insisted that there be a 'certain fasting from the public work' during the synod. In other words, he wants the work to take place without a frequent reporting of their conversations.

It is probably best to pray for those who are meeting at the Synod and to lower any expectations we may have. It is good to let the Holy Spirit move in the workings of this body. The work of the Holy Spirit can't be pressured through any expectations we might have. We can pray for those attending, for their conversations and for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit.


