## Ponderings

This coming week we celebrate: Halloween, All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. So, what are we celebrating?

### Halloween

This holiday began to evolve as early as 270 AD from the Celt's culture in Ireland who practiced a special costume party event the night before their annual feast of "Samhain"—which had a twofold purpose: to commemorate their deceased relatives and to offer thanks at the close of summer and prepare for the darkness of winter. Superstition held that the 'eve' before the feast was the time to ward off any evil spirits. Believing that demons, witches and hobgoblins were real and existed, October 31 then became an annual costume event to try through disguised appearances to fool the evil spirits into thinking they were not humans to be harmed.

With the arrival of Christian missionaries to Ireland many of the pagan practices changed. They were adapted or combined with new Christian traditions. In fact, some scholars hold that the commemoration of saints on November 1<sup>st</sup> originated in Ireland and then spread to England and the continent of Europe. By the ninth century, the Roman Catholic Church adopted the Celt's Halloween tradition and Pope Gregory IV sent out an official letter of notification urging that Halloween be observed in harmony with All Saints Day. It was called "All Hallow's Eve." (the saints were known as 'hallows'). The monks who were those early missionaries believed the celebration of the Saints was a way to dispel the Celt's superstition about ghosts and evil spirits.

### Solemnity of All Saints

The Church celebrates all the saints: canonized or beatified, and the multitude of those who are in heaven known to God alone. We might call them---anonymous saints! In the early centuries of the Church all the saints were martyrs----they were killed because they believed in Jesus Christ----and at that time Christianity was not legal. One of the earliest saints who was not a martyr was St. Martin of Tours. He was known for his holiness---not connected with being put to death as were the martyrs. It is interesting to imagine that there are saints in heaven that we knew----but were never 'officially declared' saints. In Rome there was a commemoration of the saints in the basilica of St. Mary and All Martyrs---the former Pantheon, a place that Pope Boniface IV transferred many relics from the catacombs. Pope Gregory IV (827-844) extended the observance of "all Saints" to the whole of Christendom.

### The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day)

After celebrating the feast of All Saints, today the Church prays for those who have died and are being purified awaiting heavenly glory. From the fifth century we learn of masses for the dead. St. Odilo, fourth abbot of Cluny, was responsible for the institution of the general commemoration of all the faithful departed, he fixed its celebration as November 2<sup>nd</sup>, the day after All Saints. The practice spread to the rest of Christendom. At every Mass we celebrate, we pray for the faithful departed. Masses have "intentions" ---we pray for a particular person who has died. On All Souls Day we pray in a more general way for all the faithful departed. It comes from the inclination to leave no soul without spiritual aid---and making them all the 'intention' we pray for. This is often a 'popular' day to visit a cemetery where a loved one may be buried. In some cultures, this is a family picnic day----and can be an all-day affair. On that day we, as a parish, have a special 7:00 p.m. Mass in which we remember those who have had their funeral Mass at St. Bernard in the past year. We invite their family members to join us. The celebration is open to all parishioners.
